One of his most recent contributions was as chairman of the Parish Picnic Committee, which showcased (mostly behind-the-scenes) his abilities for planning and orchestrating the many facets of this event. This was a big lift indeed and included arranging for the procurement of the food supplies, coordinating the ice cream truck and beer trailer (no, these were not connected), and commanding an army of volunteers to assemble the outdoor setting (food, condiment, and drink stations, tables and chairs for the picnic attendees, a sound system for playing background music), to cook and serve the food, and to perform the disassembly and clean up afterwards. The picnic was a big success, drawing a lot of participants who consumed about 650 hamburgers alone! He also once again did all the research to present a well-thought-out proposal for an increased council Christmas tree order, which was placed very recently. Finally, in regards to the Supreme Council's Coats for Kids Program, he took the lead in investigating, ordering, and distributing on behalf of the council a shipment of winter coats to St. Leo School and Daniel's Run School for the benefit of children in need. Most readers will have already guessed this member's name at this point, which is yet another indicator of how Tim Tilson, our Knight of the Month for September, continues to figure prominently in our council.

The council has approved purchasing 405 trees for this year. This is 45 more than last year or about an 8% increase. We will set up the tree lot on Friday November 26 starting at 9:30 a.m. The trees will arrive on Saturday November 27th again around 9:30 am. Sales start on Sunday November 28. We will sell Wednesday to Sunday like last year. Tree sales are our largest and most man power intense fund raiser in the council. We usually make \$6,000-8,000. But to succeed we need all those who can to help. So when your team captain asks please consider working a shift or two.
