My Brother Knights,

Thanks to all the Knights and their family members that helped with these events. I'm still asking every brother Knight to make a pledge to "Get Involved" in some way this fraternal year.

I would like to congratulate and thank our Knight of the Month for July – Brian Sharkey. Brian contributed his time and effort to help us install a new phone cable from the rectory to the Providence Hall. We could not have done this without his technical expertise and hard work. Congratulations to our Family of the Month for July– John & Kimmy Eldred. John & Kimmy did an outstanding job setting up the Grand Knights Ball and they led off this year's activities with a fantastic Installation Pot-Luck dinner.

Sadly, Brother Francis Minnehan passed away in July, and three of our Council members have had deaths in their family (Eddie Alamilla's mother, Emmanuel Kisob's sister, and Joe and Joan Ruzicka's son Greg). Please keep them all in your prayers.

As Knights, we are asked to be faithful to the tenants of our order (charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism). We are also charged to defend the sanctity of human life; to promote the sanctuary of life that is based upon the marriage of a man and woman. Pope John Paul II wrote in his pro-life encyclical, Evangelium Vitae (The Gospel of Life), that "Life in time, in fact, is the fundamental condition, the initial stage and an integral part of the entire unified process of human existence" The new challenges to the right to life qualitatively change the situation today from previous generations. There have always been threats to human life in the form of poverty, hunger, endemic diseases, violence and war. Personal animosity, hatred,

violence and killing have always existed. Yet until recently these conditions were viewed as obstacles to be overcome individually and collectively as a people. Only in recent years have we seen reflected in laws, court interpretations, and increasingly in public opinion, especially in the communications media, the argument that it is not wrong to take human life as long as we establish politically acceptable parameters that determine who lives and who dies. ("A People of Life and for Life" by Bishop Donald Wuerl)

Next month our council will dedicate our Right to Life Memorial, a statue of Our Lady of Providence, with the Blessed Virgin Mary holding the Christ Child. We selected this title of the Holy Mother because Providence was our Council's original name and our location in the Providence Magisterial District. Bishop Loverde will be on hand to celebrate the 11:00 a.m. mass on Sunday, October 10th and dedicate the memorial after the mass. I am asking that as many Knights and their families as possible attend this important occasion. The statue will stand directly in front of the entrance to St. Leo the Great Church for all to see our commitment to the sanctity of life.

Message from the Chancellor

Brother Knights,

Greetings as we begin another Fraternal year! As you know, the main job that I have as Chancellor is to try and recruit new members to join our Knights of Columbus council. To do this, I obviously need your help and active participation in finding, cultivating, and recruiting new members.

At the state quarterly meeting, membership was a major theme. The State Deputy's theme for the year is "Gather Us In" – to that end, I would like to address several points on membership.

I happened across a book in a bookstore and it caught my eye due to the subject matter, so I checked it out of the library and gave it a quick look. That book was entitled: "Bowling Alone: The Collapse and Revival of American Community" (by Robert D. Putnam). This book spells out quite clearly the importance of community ties and the fact that these ties have diminished in recent decades. People used to know their neighbors much better and developed what the book calls "social capital." This social capital refers to the fact that we are better members of a community when we feel ties and obligations to that community.

The book specifically mentions the Knights of Columbus and notes that:

"Many groups simultaneously bond along social dimensions and bridge across others . . . The Knights of Columbus was created to bridge cleavages among different ethnic communities while bonding across religious and gender lines."

(p. 23)

What is my point with all of this? Just this – we should be trying to reach out to those in our parish – not only for our own membership goals, but to offer these individuals the benefits of being a Knight. They may not have thought about all the value that the Knights hold for them – a chance to get involved in the church and community, to experience the church and parish with their spouses and children in a whole new light. As Knights, we have the chance to grow spiritually and connect with other men of faith –this can be of great value and we should be aware of this when we offer another man the opportunity to become a Knight.

The next time you see someone who you know is not a Knight, ask him if he is interested in joining. Perhaps you see someone at church quite regularly or your children play with their children. Talk to these individuals and see if they are interested in joining the Knights. Many of these folks have never been asked or they might have misconceptions about what the Knights are – take the opportunity to speak with them and ask them what questions or reservations they might have. Don't worry about our membership quota or making star council – think more about what the Knights can offer this individual and see if you can stress that in your conversation.




