Only having "through work" insurance doesn't work

Do you know anyone whose life has been drastically changed by the recent recession and economic downturn? Earthquake and Hurricane Irene—Minimal Damage to Providence Hall

When we rededicated the newly renovated Providence Hall we never thought it would come under attack by “Mother Nature” as severely as it has this year. On August 23 we experienced the largest earthquake since the 5.8 quake in 1897 (in south west Virginia). Five days later we were threatened by Category-I Hurricane Irene, which narrowly missed the Fairfax area but did severe damage with wind, rain and tornados to the entire Atlantic Coast of the United States. We had severe rain and high winds (over 50MPH). Providence Hall faired well from the Hurricane but the earthquake did some damage to the ceiling (see pictures). All damage has been repaired.

First Readings— Expenditures and Charities

The 2011-2012 Budget has been developed and the major programs and donations have been planned for the year. According to our bylaws, all major expenditures (over \$500) require a first and second reading prior to voting for approval. Many of the expenditures are for standard programs that the Council conducts every year. Feed the Homeless, Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter food Baskets, Scholarships, etc. Because we often only have one business meeting a month (the other meeting is often a degree or a social meeting) the finance committee will make the first “motions” for all of the following budgeted major expenditures at the Council meeting on September 13. These expenditures will be “held over” until the appropriate time of the council year. They will then be brought up as “Old Business” items at the business meeting prior to when the expenditures are planned. At that time they will be voted on for approval.

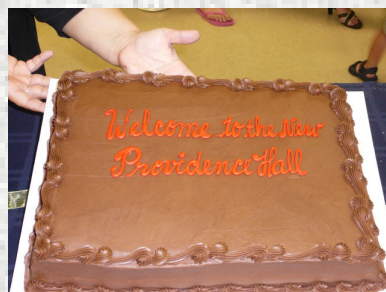

Semi-Annual Council Audit



KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SEMIANNUAL COUNCIL AUDIT REPORT FOR PERIOD ENDED June 30, 2011 Due By: August 15

COUNCIL NO. 6292 CITY Fairfax STATE Virginia

Semi-annual Audits of the Warden, Scrip and Council Funds were conducted by the Council's Trustee's for the period of January 1 to June 30 2011.. Records of all these activities were scrutinized and were in balance. The Warden's records showed a profit of \$149.60 for the period which was transferred to the Financial Secretary.

A physical count of the scrip (Food Certificates) was done and balanced with the records of the scrip manager and the financial folks. Scrip sales during period was \$17,065 (\$15,965 in Council sales and \$1100 in School sales). Profit for the period was \$790.95 of which 30% is the school share. School sales have slowly dropped off over time. We must put more effort into increasing sales in that market area.

The Council's financial records were reviewed and were in balance. The funds are well managed and the financial well being of the Council is healthy. The net worth of the

Council is \$91,753. The operating fund is at \$37,328 of which \$4266 is in checking and the remainder is in interest bearing CD's. The Building Fund currently stands at \$40,242 and the Right to Life account has \$4,333 both accounts are invested in CD's. Council income for this audit period was \$73,916, expenses were \$173,436 of which \$92,271 was expensed for the renovation and restoration of Providence Hall.

Our current membership is 353 compared to 346 at the end of the last audit period. We have 29 members whose due are in arrears for a total of \$1,739

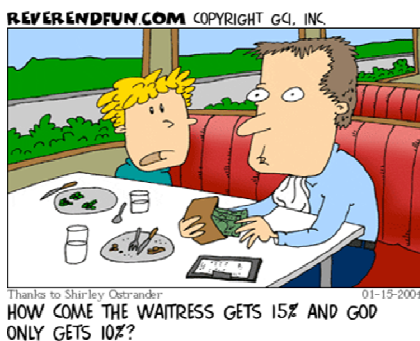

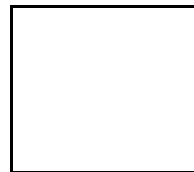
