Their nominations were made possible by Melissa Rihl, Youth Minister of St. Leo Church at the time, who provided documentation in the areas of academic performance; civic, religious, and church related activities; school and sports related extracurricular activities; special achievements/awards or other recognition received for the foregoing; and family support activities. Lourdes Navarro was a senior at Oakcrest School in Vienna; Sam Wallace was a senior at The Heights School in Potomac, MD. Both are St. Leo parishioners along with their respective families. We congratulate them both and wish them well as they take their next steps toward bright futures!

Our Knight of the Year, State Knight of Year Finalist has been a member of our order for 46 years during which he has served with distinction both this council and the Va. State Council. He has truly exemplified our order's principles of Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. He has also demonstrated deep devotion to the Catholic faith. He is both a PGK and former Financial Secretary of our council, stepping down last year from the latter position after 8 straight years(!) to concentrate more of his energies on his newly acquired position of Virginia State Vocations Chairman this year, as well as his continuing duties as Fourth Degree, Calvert Province – Virginia District Secretary. Even so, he has remained active in our council, often behind the scenes, dispensing advice as needed. He still dutifully attends all council business and officers meetings, providing guidance that flows from his wealth of experience. Most importantly, he is a prominent and active member of St. Leo Church where he and his wife, Ann, serve as Coordinators of the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. He manages to accomplish all this after he and his wife moved their residence from the City of Fairfax to Springfield last year. For all he has done and continues to do for our council, the state council, and the parish, we recognize David J. Todd, Sr., Past Grand Knight as our Knight of the

Year. Family of the Year, State Family of the Year Finalist. The family we so honor has been very active in our council, the parish, and the local community throughout the past year. He is a PGK of the council, served as Advocate last fraternal year, and has stepped up to a second stint as Deputy Grand Knight this year. He also serves as lector on a regular basis at Masses here at St. Leo Church. She is a past President and an active member of the Ladies of Fr. Diamond Council, whose projects often dovetail with those of the council. One example was her participation on behalf of the Ladies as a member of the council's 50th Anniversary Gala Committee. The family (including their adult children, when in town) work well together to develop and execute plans, especially those centered on the preparation and sale of takeout meals and desserts – the Jambalaya Dinner, potpies, dessert pies, and quiche – for the benefit of both the council and KOVAR. They've also helped with stocking the Blessings Box located on the grounds between a Van Dyck Park and the city police department, and with procuring food items as well as preparing and packaging meals in support of efforts to feed the homeless in Washington, DC. Both are volunteers for a local youth soccer league; he also served as an officer of the league. A fine example of a close, loving family that embodies our principles of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity, we honor the Family of Nelson and Julie Clinch as our Family of the Year.


