# **Mass Honoring Military & First Responders**

At 11:00 AM on Sunday, September 11, 2022, Fr. Francis J. Diamond Council #6292 and Fr. Walter F. Malloy Assembly #1894 will jointly host the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Mass Honoring Military and First Responders at St. Leo the Great Catholic Church. This annual Mass commemorates the horrific attacks of 9/11, in a positive manner by giving us the opportuni-

ty to honor and pray for those men and women who defend our nation's freedoms and liberties, and those who protect and serve our communities.

For the third year in a row, the Most Reverend SK Michael F. Burbidge, Bishop of Arlington, will join us as our Principal Celebrant; the Most Reverend SK Paul S. Loverde, Bishop Emeritus of Arlington and State Chaplain for Virginia, will join us as a Concelebrant, as will the Very Rev. SK Philip S. Majka, Faithful Friar of Fr. Malloy Assembly, and Rev. Jonathon R. Fioramonti, Chaplain of Fr. Diamond Council, amongst others. Guests in attendance will include the Fire Chief of Arlington County, the Chief of Police and Executive Deputy Chief of Police for Fairfax County, Police Captains from Fairfax and Prince William Counties, and a Police Lieutenant from the City of Fairfax. We will also be joined by many State officiants, SK Patrick A. Rowland (State Deputy), and SK Hampton H. "Trey" Hart, III (State Secretary), as well as many others from Knights higher ranks. The State Deputy will bring with him the State Council's Ecumenical Chalice, which was both blessed and used by Pope John Paul II. Finally, the Honor America Corps will be bringing with them several flags which will be displayed during the Mass.

With all that is going on with this Mass, much help is needed. Any and all Sir Knights who have the Official Regalia are asked and encouraged to participate in the Honor Guard; swords will be worn, but will not be drawn in accordance with the guidelines regarding Masses with Bishop Burbidge; muster is by 10:30 AM. Please advise Color Corps Commander SK George H. Billy, if you will be participating in the Honor Guard. All other Sir Knights are encouraged to attend in Social Dress Uniform with your name badge. All other Brother Knights are encouraged to attend in business attire (that is, coat & tie) with your name badge. All Officers (3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Degree) should wear their Jewel of Office, and all Past or Former Officers are encouraged to wear their corresponding miniature ribbons.

A picture will be taken in front of the church immediately following the Mass.

SK James T. Hogan will be heading up traffic control in the parking lot: specifically, arranging for the parking of any official vehicles (from police cruisers to potentially fire trucks and/or ambulances). SK Matthew T. West, and SK Patrick A. McGuire will be heading up the reception in the school gym. 
