Make a New Year's Resolution to Get in the Picture for 2020

Proposed Bylaw Change to Standing Resolution #1

The Council's Building fund was established to provide a facility adequate for the needs of Father Diamond Council. In 1992 we added standing resolution #1 to our bylaws to address the situation as it existed at that time. By 2009 the Building Fund had grown to over \$120,000. At that time our pastor, Father Whitestone, implemented a significant expansion and upgrade of the building meeting all of the parish's and the council's needs for a meeting facility. Father Diamond Council contributed approximately \$80,000, from the Building Fund, and hundreds of man hours to the effort. We made additional improvements such as chair rails, cabinets, pantry shelves, new phone system, additional kitchen equipment, etc. These improvements were paid for through the building fund. Since the original standing resolution is no longer accurate, we would like to revise the standing resolution to better reflect the needs of the council. It is important that the Building Fund continue to be used only for major maintenance and/or improvement activities related to Providence Hall. Therefore all such improvements will be vetted by the Building Committee and closely coordinated with the Pastor before presentation to the whole Council for approval. The revised Standing Resolution #1 is as follows:

1. Whereas, Father Diamond Council operates its Council Providence Hall, on St. Leo's Parish property at the pleasure of the

Whereas, The continuing needs of Father Diamond Council may require maintenance and/or improvements to Providence Hall; and

Whereas, Father Diamond Council currently has \$43,000 (plus or minus) in its building fund; now therefore

Be it resolved, That the current Grand Knight of Father Diamond Council and/or his successors appoint a Building Committee to devise a plan for the maintenance and/or improvement of Providence Hall, in coordination with the pastor, to meet the continuing needs of Father Diamond Council; and

Be it further resolved, that the status of said planning will be brought before the council periodically for information or decision by vote of the council as appropriate.

Discussion and voting in this resolution will occur at the first business meeting in February, 2020.
